<p><b>AGREED STIPULATION REGARDING  DECEMBER 2, 2020 ORDER</b></p>	

The Court-Appointed Receiver Gary Schwartz (“Receiver”) and Non-Party JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A. (“Chase” and, together with the Receiver, the “Parties”), by and through their undersigned counsel, hereby submit this agreed stipulation concerning the Court’s December 2, 2020 Order regarding Receiver’s Motion to Compel JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A. to Respond to the Subpoena Duces Tecum (the “Order”), and state as follows:

1. Counsel for the Receiver and Chase have conducted an initial meet and conferral concerning the Court’s Order, as well as the appropriate scope of production in response to the

categories of documents and information included in the subpoena duces tecum at issue (the “Subpoena”).

2. In order to allow the Receiver and Chase to reach agreement on the appropriate scope of production in response to the Subpoena, and as part of their effort to avoid further motion practice at this time in relation to the Order, the Parties have agreed that the deadline for Chase to respond to the Subpoena shall be extended by thirty-five (35) days, up to and including January 20, 2020.

3. Counsel for the Parties will continue to confer in good faith regarding the appropriate scope of production in response to the Subpoena, including, without limitation, on the parameters for a reasonable electronic search protocol to identify and produce relevant and non-privileged electronic communications, as well as the appropriate date range for potentially relevant documents.

4. For documents that are identified and ready for production in advance of January 20, 2020, Chase will begin making productions on a rolling basis.

5. The Parties further stipulate that if they are not able to reach agreement as to any particular category of documents in the Subpoena after good faith discussion, which has not yet occurred, they will seek the Court’s assistance with resolving any such dispute.

6. Nothing in this stipulation shall be construed as the Receiver’s agreement to re-litigate the relevancy of the documents sought by the Subpoena.
